OPERATIONAL REFERENDUM

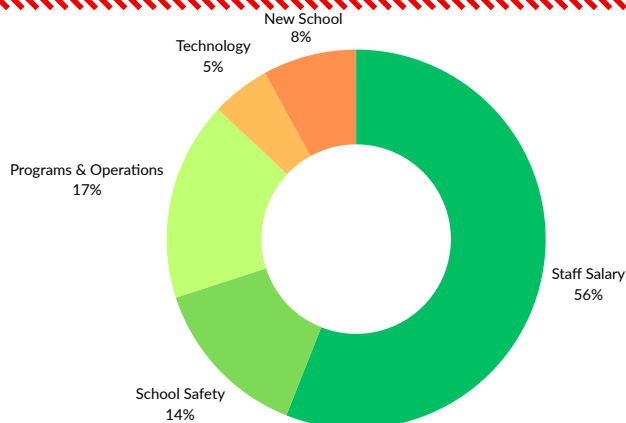

TAX IMPACT

- In New Castle County, taxes would increase by \$0.3933 for every \$100 of a property's assessed value.
*based on current assessed value
- In Kent County, taxes would increase by \$.0924 for every \$100 of a property's assessed value.



FAQs

What is an operating referendum?

The Smyrna School District is asking for an increase in property taxes to provide funding for important school programs, staffing, and operational costs. The additional funding will ensure that our schools can continue to provide safe, high-quality education to all students.

What if the referendum does not pass?

If the referendum is not approved, the district will face budget shortfalls, which could result in cuts to programs, staffing issues, and other resources that directly impact students and staff.

Why does the district need more funding?

The funding will support:

- Hiring and keeping talented teachers and staff
- Enhancing school safety
- Supporting programs and extracurricular activities at the new middle school
- Improving technology for students and classrooms
- Purchasing new high school band uniforms and instruments

How do I vote?

All district residents, 18 years or older, are eligible to vote on **March 15, 2025**, from 7am-8pm.
