SMYRNA DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR **HOLLY HUFFORD**

Holly Hufford, Agri-science teacher at Smyrna Middle School is a 1999 graduate of Smyrna High School. Mrs. Hufford strives to establish a curriculum that is thought provoking, hands-on and encourages higher level thinking skills. In most cases, the Agri-science classroom is the first encounter these students have with knowledge about livestock, commercial agriculture, greenhouse production, and floral and landscape design. Holly uses their energy and need for knowledge as a motivator to create lessons that are engaging, relatable, and important for her students' lives.

As an Agri-science Exploratory Instructor, Holly feels much of her duty is to provide a base knowledge for her students. Not all of Mrs. Hufford's eighth graders will take the opportunity provided to enter the Agri-science Pathway at the high school but all of them will eventually be consumers of agricultural products. Her goal is for each and every student who exits her classroom to have the problem-solving skills and knowledge to be able to decipher the facts in agriculture versus misconceptions and untruths. Holly strives for them to be able to communicate these truths versus the common misconceptions with people who do not know any better. After completion of eighth grade Agri-science, they will be able to spread their knowledge making even more people educated consumers.

One way to engage students and create an environment that they want to discuss outside of the classroom to others, is for them to have experiences with hands-on applications. Students in Mrs. Hufford's classroom have had an active role in animal grooming, training, and in the canine whelping process. It is Holly's goal to provide them with experiences they will not soon forget, and will want to discuss with students, adults, and community members outside of the classroom.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

From the Superintendent's Desk...

This summer has been unlike any other we can remember. Daily, we face challenges to our daily routines and habits. Still, our district has been actively preparing for months to provide a safe instructional plan for our students. As we open our classrooms virtually to students this fall and prepare for a rolling **hybrid** return to our schools, beginning October 5th, we are excited to share how this will look.

Barring further changes in Governor Carney's order, we are spending the month of September in virtual instruction and then "rolling" into hybrid instruction, beginning in early October:

- From Sept. 8 through Oct. 2, Grades Prek-12 Virtual Instruction.
- From Oct. 5 through Oct. 23, Grades K-3 Hybrid; Grades Prek and 4-12 Virtual.
- From Oct. 26 through Nov. 13, Grades PreK 6 Hybrid; Grades 7-12 Virtual.
- From Nov. 16 through Dec. 4, Grades PreK 8 Hybrid; Grades 9-12 Virtual.
- From Dec. 7 until Gov. Carney issues a new order, All Students Grades PreK 12 Hybrid.

Beginning Wednesday, September 16th, and every Wednesday during both virtual and hybrid instruction, each school building will be closed in order to complete deep cleaning, sanitization and supply replacement. However, all students, teachers, educators, and paraprofessionals will participate each Wednesday in virtual instruction, interventions and academic support from their homes.

There are many issues, of course, surrounding our district's re-opening, and our task force teams examined them this summer, establishing protocols for all of us. For example, our Supervisor of Transportation, Mrs. Sharon Almondo, is creating routes that accommodate our families' needs during hybrid instruction later this fall and support social distancing, mask wearing and all safety precautions. Siblings who reside in the same household will be scheduled to attend schools on the same days during the hybrid instructional period to make it easier on our families. Meals-breakfast and lunch-will be provided daily in the school to students who report once hybrid instruction begins, and in the meantime, we are providing remote meal service to our families during virtual instruction. Details are available on the Smyrna School District Child Nutrition Program site. Our primary efforts focus on supporting healthy and safe education for everyone during the student day. Consequently, the "rolling" hybrid instructional model will require all students and staff to adhere to Division of Public Health mandates, including but not limited to social distancing, regular sanitizing and mandatory mask wearing.

We understand that this is a stressful time for you, for your children, for all of us. Our mission is to provide meaningful instruction in a safe and healthy environment. Please take care of yourselves, and thank you, as always, for your ongoing support.

The Kindness Project: Pets




SES Welcomes Back Taylor Ryan
